The third question of Fatwa no. 4160

Q 3: What is the ruling on slaughtering an animal for guests even though Allah (Exalted be He) says: (...and that on which Allâh's Name has not been mentioned while slaughtering, (that which has been slaughtered as a sacrifice for others than Allâh)?

A: It is permissible to slaughter an animal for a guest and the name of Allah is mentioned upon slaughtering it and it is not included in the general saying of Allah (Exalted be He): (...and that on which Allâh's Name has not been mentioned while slaughtering, (that which has been slaughtered as a sacrifice for others than Allâh) The Ayah (Qur`anic verse) refers to what is offered for other than Allah (Exalted be He)

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like slaughtering for the dead and the like, as a means of drawing closer to them. However, slaughtering for guests aims at serving them generously; not worshipping them, for the Messenger of Allah (peace be upon him) ordered Muslims to entertain guests generously.
