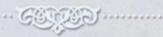

In the Name of Allāh, the Most Gracious, the Most Merciful

All thanks and praise are due to Allāh, and prayers and blessings are upon the leader of Messengers, our Prophet Muḥammad, his family and companions.

As for what follows:

Peace and blessings be upon you, brothers:

We will talk today about the remembrance of Allāh and what Allāh says:

"Verily, in the remembrance of Allāh do the hearts find rest." [Sūrah Ar-Ra'd 13:28]

The remembrance of Allāh has countless benefits and a great effect. Using it, hearts and souls find rest. It brings blessings and prevents evils. It makes the

servant happy and successful in this worldly life and the Hereafter. The more committed the servant to remembrance, the more integrated his happiness.

When Allāh, the Almighty, says:



"Verily, in the remembrance of Allāh do the hearts find rest."

It means that it imparts restfulness and tranquility. When we think about this gracious verse and the reality of peoples' hearts in this worldly life, it is really complicated and filled with desires, attraction by lusts, suspicions, and seditions; leaving no place for rest in the heart save a sense of loss, displeasure, and annoyance; in short, restlessness. It means that these hearts felt restless, annoyed and lost in which one suffers from suspicions and doubts. All of it are diseases of the heart. No heart can be restful unless with the remembrance of Allāh. If it is free from the remembrance of Allāh, it is vulnerable to be infected with those illnesses. Thus, Allāh (المنتحة عنه عنه عنه says:

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"Those who believed (in the Oneness of Allāh - Islamic Monotheism), and whose hearts find rest in the remembrance of Allāh: Verily, in the remembrance of Allāh do the hearts find rest."

So, restfulness of hearts is to be happy and tranquil, free from worries and annoyance; this can be achieved by the remembrance of Allāh.

Without the remembrance of Allāh, the heart will die. Abu Musa Al-Asha'ri narrated that the Prophet (صَالَاتُهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالَمَ) said:

"The similitude of one who remembers his Lord and one who does not remember Him is like that of the living and the dead."

The Prophet (صَاَلِتَهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالَمُ gave the example of the one who remembers Allāh with the living and the one who does not remember Allāh with the dead; and in another narration by Muslim, the Prophet (صَاَلِتُهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَامًا) said:

"The house of which remembrance of Allāh is made and the house in which Allāh is not remembered are like the living and the dead respectively."

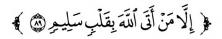
So, the Prophet (صَّالَتُهُ عَلَيْهُ وَسَلَّمُ) gave an example of the house where Allāh is remembered with the living and the house where Allah is not remembered with the house of the dead (i.e. graves).

When we combine the words of both Ḥadīths, we find that there is a similitude of those who remember Allāh (شَبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَى) and fill their houses with the remembrance of Allāh (شَبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَى) with living ones in houses filled with life, while the ones who do not remember Allāh and no remembrance is made in their houses with the dead in the houses of the dead, as if his chest is a grave for his heart with no real life in but an animalistic one.

So, hearts are divided into:

❖ A sound heart

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"Except him who comes to Allāh with a sound heart [clean from Shirk (polytheism) and Nifāq (hypocrisy)]." [Sūrah Ash-Shu'arā '26:89]

A sound heart is a type of heart which is clean from diseases and bad intentions. It is purified for the sake of Allāh, and the deeds are cleaned. Thus this one resorts to Allāh only and rely on no one but Him, and performs acts of worship only to Allāh (سُنْحَانُهُوْتَعَالُ). If it loves, it loves for the sake of Allāh; if it hates, it hates for the sake of Allāh; if it supports, it supports one for the sake of Allāh. It is a clean heart, empty from diseases and lusts. It is closer to Allāh (سُنْحَانُهُوْتَعَالُ), remembers Him, and worships Him only.

❖ Second type: dead heart. It is the heart which turns away from his Lord and Creator and worships others. It fails to comply with His orders, perform acts of worship, remember Allāh, act righteous good deeds, ask others in situations of hope, desire, and fear, love, and hatred. It directs acts of worship and righteous good deeds for another than Allah. This is a dead heart.

❖ The third type of hearts: the heart that features both life and death. It is charged with life when it is truthful, sincere, monotheistic, and desiring for the worship of Allāh, whereas it lacks this life when it is desires lusts and suspicions. The heart is qualified either dead or alive in pursuance with the dominant drive.

The life of the heart is sustainable when one keeps closer to Allāh and remembers Allāh (سُبْحَانُهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) with his heart and tongue, whereby suspicions and lusts will be removed. If one does not remember Allāh, more evils and diseases shall reside.



"Verily, in the remembrance of Allāh do the hearts find rest."

How can these hearts find rest? Through obeying Allāh, and relying upon Him and resorting to Allāh Alone. Whoever asks Allāh Alone, hopes for Allāh Alone, fears Allāh Alone, relies upon Allāh Alone, depends upon Allāh in all matters because his heart is assured with the remembrance of Allāh, for performing Tawheed and obeying Allāh (شُبْحَالُهُ وَتَعَالَى).

Oh, brothers! Consider how the Prophet (مَالَالُهُ عَالَيْهِ وَاللّهُ عَالَى cured who is afflicted with sadness, distress, and anxiety so we can appreciate the value of the cure that the Prophet (مَالَاللهُ مَاللهُ) ordained by the remembrance of Allāh. All of us know that one can be afflicted with sadness, distress, and anxiety. According to the scholars, the heart can be afflicted with these diseases, one of which is related to the past (sadness), the other is related to the present time (distress), and the third is related to the future (anxiety).

Sadness is related to the past; one feels sad when goals are not achieved. For example, one wants to make a deal, but it fails, which causes the heart to develop a growing feeling of sadness.

Distress happens when one is discontent with his present situation.

If one is worried about his future, he may be anxious.

These diseases cannot be cured except with the remembrance of Allāh, and the heart cannot find rest without the assistance of Allāh. Unfortunately, brothers, when many people are afflicted with sadness, distress, and anxiety, he seeks to cure it without dependence upon Allāh or remembrance of Him. However, some people do things that incur

distress and sadness, thinking they entertain the heart and make sadness go away. The heart cannot find restfulness with bad deeds; only resorting to Allāh is the proper mean to it.

How can distress, sadness, and anxiety be cured? Consider the words of the Prophet (صَالَاتُهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالَمُ) concerning the cure of these diseases. The Prophet (صَالَاتُهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالَمُ) said:

مَا أَصَابَ أَحَدًا قَطُّ هَمُّ وَلَا حَزَنُ فَقَالَ: اللَّهُمَّ إِنِّي عَبْدُكَ وَابْنُ عَبْدُكَ وَابْنُ عَبْدِكَ وَابْنُ عَبْدِكَ وَابْنُ أَمْتِكَ نَاصِيَتِي بِيَدِكَ مَاضٍ فِيَّ حُكْمُكَ عَدْلُ فِيَّ قَضَاؤُكَ أَسْأَلُكَ بِكِلِّ اسْمٍ هُو لَكَ سَمَّيْتَ بِهِ نَفْسَكَ أَوْ عَلَّمْتَهُ أَحَدًا مِنْ خَلْقِكَ أَوْ أَنْزَلْتَهُ فِي كِتَابِكَ أَوْ اسْتَأْثَرْتَ بِهِ فِي عِلْمِ أَحَدًا مِنْ خَلْقِكَ أَوْ أَنْزَلْتَهُ فِي كِتَابِكَ أَوْ اسْتَأْثَرْتَ بِهِ فِي عِلْمِ الْعَيْبِ عِنْدَكَ أَنْ تَجْعَلَ الْقُرْآنَ رَبِيعَ قَلْبِي وَنُورَ صَدْرِي وَجِلَاءَ الْغَيْبِ عِنْدَكَ أَنْ تَجْعَلَ الْقُرْآنَ رَبِيعَ قَلْبِي وَنُورَ صَدْرِي وَجِلَاءَ حُرْنِي وَذَهَابَ هَمِّي إِلَّا أَذْهَبَ اللَّهُ هَمَّهُ وَحُزْنَهُ وَأَبْدَلَهُ مَكَانَهُ فَرَجًا

"If any Muslim is afflicted with distress and makes this supplication, then his supplication will be answered: O Allāh, I am Your servant, the son of Your servant, the son of Your maidservant. My forelock is in Your hand, Your command concerning me prevails, and

Your decision concerning me is just. I call upon You by every one of the Beautiful Names by which You have described Yourself, or which You have revealed in Your Book, or You have taught to anyone of Your creatures, or which You have chosen to keep in the knowledge of the unseen with You, to make the Qur' an the delight of my heart, the light of my chest, and to remove my sadness and dispel my anxiety." The Prophet (صَا اللهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالًم) said: "If he says this, Allah will remove his affliction and replace it with joy and happiness." They said, "O Messenger of Allah, should we not learn it?" The Prophet (صَالَّ اللَّهُ عَالَيْهِ وَسَلَّمَ) said: Yes, whoever hears it should know it."

So, sadness, distress, and anxiety can be replaced by happiness.

How can this heart be happy? Saying these supplications without thinking about its meanings would be meaningless because these remembrances and supplications are worthy of deep consideration.

When one is afflicted with sadness, distress, and anxiety, he should mention starting with "O Allāh! I am your servant." This is a confession that he is a

servant of Allāh (سُبْحَانَهُوَتَعَالَ), who is His Creator and Sustainer. A servant means a worshipper who obeys the orders of Allāh (سُبْحَانهُوَتَعَالَ).

"O Allāh! I am your servant the son of your servant, the son of your maidservant." I am your servant, and my father's till Adam are servants of You; all of us are servants of You and You are our Creator, Lord, and Sustainer.

"My forelock is in your hand;" forelock is the forehead. I do not have anything unless with Your will and Power. If You want me to live, I will live. If You want me to be happy, I will be happy. If You want me to be healthy, I will be well and healthy. If You want me to be rich, I will be rich. If You want anything else like disease, poverty, I will be ill and poor. My forelock is in Your hand, your Will and Power rule all things:

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What you want will happen even if I do not want

But what I want will not happen if You do not want.

You created people according to Your knowledge.

The actions of the young and the old man are consistent with Your knowledge

You gave, You took,

You support, and You forsake.

In the world, there are poor, happy, ugly and beautiful ones.

"My forelock is in your hand" You are the Lord, the Sustainer, and I am a servant with no power but in You, as in the supplication:

"There is no power but in Allāh." No change from case to case and no power of the servant but in Allāh (شُبْحَانُهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) so he said: "My forelock is in your hand."

"Your command concerning me prevails." Your judgment will prevail with no objection because Allāh's will is sure. There is none who can reverse His judgment.

"Your command concerning me prevails" What Allāh wills comes to pass and what He does not will not come to pass.

"Your decision concerning me is just." O Allāh! You are Just. He wrongs not, even the weight of an atom (or a small ant), and all that He judges is just.

Then one resorts to Allāh by His Beautiful Names and Great attributes.

"I call upon You by every one of the Beautiful Names by which You have described Yourself." Meaning: O Allāh! I call upon You with all Your Names. It is known that the best way to call upon

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Allāh is by His Names and Attributes. Allāh (شُبْحَانُهُوَتَعَالَ) says:

"And (all) the Most Beautiful Names belong to Allāh, so call on Him by them." [$S\bar{u}rah\ Al-A'r\bar{a}f$ 7:180]

And Allāh (سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) says:

"Say (O Muḥammad (صَالَعُنَا عَلَيْهِ وَسَالَمُ)): "Invoke Allāh or invoke the Most Gracious (Allāh), by whatever name you invoke Him (it is the same), for to Him belong the Best Names." [Sūrah Al-Isra' 17:110]

And Allah (سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) says:

"Allāh! La ilaha illa Huwa (none has the right to be worshiped but He)! To Him belong the Best Names." [Sūrah Taha 21:8]

and Allah (سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) says:

"He is Allāh, beside Whom La ilaha illa Huwa (none has the right to be worshiped but He) the All-Knower of the unseen and the seen. He is the Most Gracious, the Most Merciful. He is Allāh beside Whom La ilaha illa Huwa (none has the right to be worshiped but He), the King, the Holy, the One Free from all defects, the Giver of security, the Watcher over His creatures, the All-Mighty, the Compeller, the Supreme. Glorified is Allāh! (High is He)

Above all that they associate as partners with Him. He is Allāh, the Creator, the Inventor of all things, the Bestower of forms. To Him belong the Best Names. All that is in the heavens and the earth glorify Him. And He is the All-Mighty, the All-Wise." [Sūrah Al-Hashr 59:22-24]

So, the servant calls upon Allāh with His Most Beautiful Names.

"I call upon You by every one of the Beautiful Names by which You have described Yourself, or which You have revealed in Your Book, or You have taught to anyone of Your creatures, or which You have chosen to keep in the knowledge of the unseen with You."

I call upon You with all Your Beautiful Names.

Then he requests,

"To make the Qur' an the delight of my heart."

What is in his heart? In his heart, there is sadness and distress that make him sick, so he wants to remove it by these ways, and then called upon Allāh, "to make the Qur' ān the delight of my heart" to make me busy with the Qur' ān, to make my heart full of the Qur' ān. When the heart is occupied with the Qur' ān, there will be no sadness, no distress, no anxiety because there is no place for these diseases. Sadness, distress, and anxiety cannot find a way to his heart as it is full of the remembrance of Allāh.

"To make the Qur' an the spring of my heart, the light of my chest."

Consider that when the heart is mentioned, he said "the spring of my heart" and when the chest is mentioned he said: "the light of my chest."

Thus, he mentioned the spring and the light. The spring refers to nutrition, plants, life and increase. It is known that is the life of the human body and setting it right arise from the heart. Also, growth and life of plants and trees are from its origin, thus when the heart is set right, the body will be right. So, he said:

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أَنْ تَجْعَلَ الْقُرْآنَ رَبِيعَ قَلْبِي

"to make the Qur' an the spring of my heart."

Meaning: make it nourish the heart, like water that feeds plants. You know how the plant will be if it is not irrigated with water? It will die, but if it is watered, it will bloom. Allāh (سُبْحَانُهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) says:

﴿ ﴿ أَلَمْ يَأْنِ لِلَّذِينَ ءَامَنُواْ أَن تَخْشَعَ قُلُوبُهُمْ لِذِكِرِ ٱللَّهِ وَمَا نَزَلَ مِنَ ٱلْحَقِّ وَلَا يَكُونُواْ كَالَّذِينَ أُوتُواْ ٱلْكِتَبَ مِن قَبَلُ فَطَالَ عَلَيْهِمُ ٱلْأَمَدُ فَقَسَتْ قُلُوبُهُمْ وَكَثِيرٌ مِنْهُمْ فَلِيقُونَ ۞ ٱعْلَمُواْ أَنَّ ٱللَّهَ يُحْيِ ٱلْأَرْضَ بَعْدَ مَوْتِهَا قَدْ بَيَّنَا لَكُو ٱلْآيَتِ لَعَلَكُمْ تَعْقِلُونَ ۞ ﴾

"Has not the time come for the hearts of those who believe (in the Oneness of Allāh - Islamic Monotheism) to be affected by Allāh's Reminder (this Qur' ān), and that which has been revealed of the truth, lest they become as those who received the Scripture [the Taurat (Torah) and the Injeel (Gospel)] before (i.e. Jews and Christians), and the term was prolonged for them and so their hearts were hardened? And many of them were Fāsiqūn (the rebellious, the disobedient to Allāh).

Know that Allāh gives life to the earth after its death! Indeed, We have made clear the Ayat (proofs, evidence, verses, lessons, signs, revelations, etc.) to you if you but understand." [Sūrah Al-Hadid 57:16-17]

Allāh (سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) called the Qur' ān Rūh (Revelation) in many verses in the Qur' ān as Allāh (سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) says:

"The Commandment (the Hour or the punishment of the disbelievers and polytheists or the Islamic laws or commandments) ordained by Allāh will come to pass, so, seek not to hasten it. Glorified and Exalted is He above all that they associate as partners with Him. He sends down the angels with the Ruh (revelation) of His Command to whom of His slaves He wills (saying): "Warn (mankind) that La ilaha illa Ana (none has the right to be worshipped but I), so fear Me (by abstaining

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from sins and evil deeds)." [Sūrah An-Nahl 16: 1-2]

In another verse, Allāh (سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) says:

"And thus, We have sent to you (O Muḥammad (صَلَاللَهُعَلَيْهُوسَلَةً)) Rūh (a Revelation, and a Mercy) of Our Command."

And,

"And thus, We have sent to you (O Muḥammad (مَالَالُهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالًا)) Rūh (a Revelation, and a Mercy) of Our Command. You knew not what is the Book, nor what is Faith? But We have made it (this Qur'ān) a light wherewith We guide whosoever of Our Slaves We will. And verily, you (O Muḥammad (مَالَالُهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالًا)) are indeed guiding (mankind) to a Straight Path

(i.e. Allāh's Religion of Islāmic Monotheism)." [Sūrah Ash-Shura 42:52]

So, the Qur' ān is a life for the heart. In this Ḥadīth, one calls upon Allāh to fill his heart with the Qur' ān and remembrance of Allāh so as to remove the diseases in the heart.

"The light of my chest;" make a light in my chest by caring and keeping the Noble Qur' ān. This indicates that the Qur' ān and the remembrance of Allāh make the heart full of light.

O' brothers! How can sadness, distress, and anxiety affect a heart the Qur' ān is its spring and light? However, weakness of faith affects a man badly so his heart may be afflicted with those diseases, which will cause the heart to become restless, suspicious and bored.

"To make the Qur' and the delight of my heart, the light of my chest, and to remove my sadness and dispel my anxiety." One asks Allah to remove sadness from the heart and to dispel the anxiety.

The Prophet (صَالَةَ عُلَيْهِ وَسَالًمَ) said:

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إِلَّا أَذْهَبَ اللَّهُ هَمَّهُ وَغَمَّهُ وَ أَبْدَلَهُ فَرحاً

"Allāh will remove his affliction and replace it with joy and happiness."

When the companions heard this Ḥadīth, they asked the Prophet (صَالَاتَهُ عَلَيْهُ وَسَالًم):

"O Messenger of Allāh, should we not learn it?" The Prophet (صَالَاتُهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالًم) said: Yes, whoever hears it should know it."

It is a great supplication in which one can find the remembrance of Allāh (سُبْحَانُهُوَتَعَالَ) and resorting to Allāh.

So, we learned from this great Ḥadīth the value of the remembrance of Allāh and how it affects the heart concerning achieving restfulness and tranquility, in addition to removal of sadness, distress, and anxiety.

In this regard, we should not forget about the causes of restlessness of the heart. Thus, whoever wants his heart to be restful, he needs to attend to this matter; to be cautious of the causes that impact discomfort.

Allāh (سُنْحَانُوْنَعَالَ) says that there is an enemy who sees us, but we do not see, and it circulates in the human body as blood does. Also, this enemy is a dangerous one who does his best to keep one away from Allāh's obedience, and he is so malicious. This enemy relentlessly plots to turn people away from the Allāh's Path, with a long experience in doing so. Many people are caused to enter the graves upon deviance.

"And most of them believe not in Allāh except that they attribute partners to Him [i.e. they are Mushrikūn i.e. polytheists.]" [Sūrah Yusuf 12:106]

And,

"And most of mankind will not believe even if you desire it eagerly." [Sūrah Yusuf 12: 103]

Many people are deceived by Shayṭān who turned them away from what they are created for. Allāh (شُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) warned us of this enemy and said:

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﴿ إِنَّ ٱلشَّيْطَنَ لَكُمْ عَدُوٌّ فَٱتَّخِذُوهُ عَدُوًّا ﴾

"Surely, Shayṭān is an enemy to you, so take (treat) him as an enemy." [Sūrah Fatir 35:6]

Allāh (سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَى) says that this enemy will come to them from before them and behind them, from their right and their left, from all sides,

"Then I will come to them before them and behind them, from their right and their left, and You will not find most of them as thankful ones (i.e. they will not be dutiful to You)." [Sūrah Al-A'rāf 7:17]

This enemy made many plans and used many ways to turn the heart away from the remembrance of Allāh so that restfulness will go away. Allāh (سُنْحَانَهُ وَعَالَىٰ) said:

"And whosoever turns away blindly from the remembrance of the Most Gracious (Allāh) (i.e. this Qur' ān and worship of Allāh), We appoint for him a Shayṭān to be a Qarin (a companion) to him." [Sūrah az-Zukhruf 43:36]

So, Shayṭān enters one's heart when he turns away from the remembrance of Allāh. The more one's heart is turning away from the remembrance of Allāh (شَبْحَانُهُوَتَعَالَ), the more the Shayṭān will consume one's, heart. No way to prevent oneself from this Shayṭān but by the remembrance of Allāh.

Thus, the Ḥadīth related in Al-Musnad concerning the story of Allāh's order to Yahya ibn Zakarīyā (عَنَهِمَالْسَكُمْ) with five commandments to abide by, and to command the Children of Israel to abide by them.

وَآمُرُكُمْ بِذِكْرِ اللَّهِ عَزَّ وَجَلَّ كَثِيرًا ، وَإِنَّ مَثَلَ ذَلِكَ كَمَثَلِ رَجُلٍ طَلَبَهُ الْعَدُوُّ سِرَاعًا فِي أَثَرِهِ فَأَتَى حِصْنًا حَصِينًا فَتَحَصَّنَ فِيهِ ، وَإِنَّ الْعَبْدَ أَحْصَنُ مَا يَكُونُ مِنْ الشَّيْطَانِ إِذَا كَانَ فِي ذِكْرِ اللَّهِ عَزَّ وَجَلَّ

And He commands you to remember Allāh. For indeed the parable of that is a man whose enemy quickly tracks him until he reaches an

impermeable fortress in which he protects himself from them. This is how the worshipper is; he does not protect himself from Shayṭān except by the remembrance of Allāh."

This is an example of who remembers Allāh (شَبْحَانَهُوَتَعَالَ) as a man who entered a fortress to protect himself from the enemy. Many scholars used the word 'fortress' to name their books concerning the remembrance of Allāh, because the Muslim protects himself, his heart, his home by the remembrance of Allāh (شُبْحَانُهُ وَتَعَالَىٰ).

It is narrated in the Ḥadīth that if one entered his house without saying "in the name of Allāh," the Shayṭān say, 'You have found a place to stay the night, and if he started eating without saying, "in the name of Allāh," Shayṭān says, 'you have found food.' This indicates that if one is committed to the remembrance of Allāh when entering and leaving the house, drinking and eating, mounting and dismounting, and all other cases, Shayṭān cannot find a way to his heart. This is the meaning of what Allāh (النبَحَانُةُ وَتَعَالَىٰ) says:

"And whosoever turns away blindly from the remembrance of the Most Gracious (Allāh) (i.e. this Qur'ān and worship of Allāh), We appoint for him (Shayṭān) to be a Qarin (a companion) to him." [Sūrah az-Zukhruf 43:36]

The Prophet (صَلَّالَتُهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَلَّمَ) said:

"Shayṭān doesn't enter the house in which Sūrah Baqarah is recited."

It is related in the Ḥadīth that whoever recited Ayatul-Kursi at night, then, no Shayṭān shall come near him till the morning, and Allāh will protect him. Also, it is related that if one intends to have sexual intercourse with his wife, he should say:

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"In the Name of Allāh, O Allāh! Keep us away from Shayṭān and keep Shayṭān away from what You have bestowed upon us;" and if Allāh has ordained a child for them, Shayṭān will never harm him."

These are fortifications and supplications to protect them from Shayṭān.

Furthermore, it is related that,

"He who recites the two verses at the end of Surat Al-Baqarah at night, they will suffice him."

It will protect him by seeking refuge with Allāh (سُبْحَانُهُوَتَعَالَ) from the enemy.

"And if an evil whisper from Shayṭān (Shayṭān) tries to turn you away (from doing good), then seek refuge in Allāh. Verily, He is

the All-Hearer, the All-Knower." [Sūrah Fussilat 41:36]

And,

"And say: "My Lord! I seek refuge with You from the whisperings (suggestions) of the Shayatin (plural of Shayṭān). And I seek refuge with You, My Lord! lest they should come near me." [Sūrah Al-Mu'minun 23:97-98]

And,

"Say: "I seek refuge with (Allāh) the Lord of mankind, The King of mankind - The Ilah (God) of mankind, From the evil of the whisperer (Shayṭān who whispers evil in the

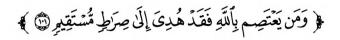
hearts of men) who withdraws (from his whispering in one's heart after one remembers Allāh). Who whispers in the breasts of mankind; of Jinn and men." [Sūrah An-Nās 114:1-6]

Ibn Abbas (هَوَلِيَكُ) said pertaining the meaning of (whisperer who withdraws):

هذا الشيطان إذا غفل الإنسان عن ذكر الله وسوس - يعني الشيطان - وسوس للإنسان ، فإذا ذكر الإنسان الله خنس - يعني ذهب وابتعد -

"This is the Shayṭān when one turns away from the remembrance of Allāh, Shayṭān will whisper, but when Allāh is remembered, Shayṭān will withdraw."

Thus, one needs always to remember Allāh so that the Shayṭān withdraws and turns away from him. However, if one continues keeping away from the remembrance of Allāh, Shayṭān will enter his heart. So, one needs to draw closer to Allāh (سُنِمَانُوْنَعَالَ), rely upon Him, resort to Him. Thus Shayṭān will be driven away.



"And whoever holds firmly to Allāh, (i.e. follows Islam - Allāh's religion, and practically obeys all that Allāh has ordered), then he is indeed guided to a Right Path." [Sūrah Al-Imran3:101]

The Prophet (صَّلَاللَهُ عَلَيْهُ وَسَالَمٌ) was saying in his supplication – in the morning, afternoon and when sleeping:

اللَّهُمَّ فَاطِرَ السَّمَوَاتِ وَالْأَرْضِ عَالِمَ الْغَيْبِ وَالشَّهَادَةِ لَا إِلَهَ إِلَّا أَنْتَ رَبَّ كُلِّ شَيْءٍ وَمَلِيكَهُ أَعُوذُ بِكَ مِنْ شَرِّ نَفْسِي وَمِنْ شَرِّ أَنْتَ رَبَّ كُلِّ شَيْءٍ وَمَلِيكَهُ أَعُوذُ بِكَ مِنْ شَرِّ نَفْسِي وَمِنْ شَرِّ الشَّيْطَانِ وَشِرْكِهِ وَأَنْ أَقْتَرِفَ عَلَى نَفْسِي سُوءًا أَوْ أَجُرَّهُ إِلَى مُسْلِمٍ

"O Allāh! Creator of the heavens and the earth, Who knows the unseen and the seen, Lord and Possessor of everything. I testify that there is none has the right to be worshiped but You; I seek refuge in You from the evil within myself, from the evil of the Shayṭān, and his (incitement to) attributing partners (to Allāh). And that we commit sin for ourselves or drag it to a Muslim."

So, one seeks refuge from the evil, its source, and its result, saying: "the evil within myself, from the evil

of the Shayṭān, and his (incitement to) attributing partners (to Allāh)." This is seeking refuge from the cause of evil: the evil self, the cursed Shayṭān, and the result of evil.

Ibn Abbas (المُعْنَفَقَةُ) was told, "The Jews said the Shayṭān does not come to them when performing prayers, no whispers, no outside thoughts come to their mind. He said, "what does the Shayṭān do with a dead heart?" The dead heart is a closed case; Shayṭān tries his best to whisper to the living and faithful heart. Thus, one always need to strive against Shayṭān and to seek refuge in Allāh from the evil of the Shayṭān. Allāh (المُنْهَاتُونَةُ says,

"As for those who strives hard in Us (Our Cause), We will surely guide them to Our Paths (i.e. Allāh's religion - Islamic Monotheism). And verily, Allāh is with the Muhsinīn (good-doers)." [Sūrah Al-Ankabut 29: 69].

The scholars mentioned many benefits of the remembrance of Allāh to achieve the restfulness of the heart. Ibn Al-Qayyim authored a book entitled "Al-Wābil As-Sayyib" on this subject, and it should be kept and read. "Al-Wābil As-Sayyib" means the useful rain. This book has many important benefits: It states the benefits of remembrance. He (عَمَا لَهُ اللهُ mentioned more than seventy benefits. When you read these important benefits, you will keep closer to Allāh and will be committed to the remembrance of Allāh (المُنْهَالَةُ وَاللّهُ اللهُ اللهُ

Of these benefits, he said:

"Remembrance of Allāh unites the disunited and disunite the United."

This is one of the benefits of the remembrance of Allāh. The heart requires the presence of various elements that affect its restfulness that is only obtainable through the remembrance of Allāh. In contrast, remembrance disunites the diseases filling the heart such as sadness, distress, lusts and suspicions. These diseases cannot be dispelled except with the remembrance of Allāh (الشَيْحَانُةُ وَقَعَالًى).

When heart feels restful, and at ease by the remembrance of Allāh, all organs of the body feel

restful and willfully perform good deeds. The Prophet (صَالَاللَهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالًمَ) said in authentic Ḥadīth:

"Beware! There is a piece of flesh in the body if it becomes good (reformed), the whole body becomes good, but if it gets spoilt, the whole gets spoilt; and that is the heart."

One came to Al-Hasan Al-Basrī and said:

"I feel my heart merciless, what can I do for solving this problem? He said, 'you should make it turn away by the remembrance of Allāh.'

Meaning: remember Allāh a lot so that this mercilessness will be removed.

Let's finish our talk with a great benefit: Allāh (سُبْحَانُهُوَتَعَالَىٰ) said in the Noble Ḥadīth:

"I am with my servant when he remembers Me and his lips move with My mention."

So, one who remembers Allāh is honorably closer to Him (شُبْحَانَهُوَتَعَالَ).

Also, Allāh is generally with us through Allāh's knowledge as indicated in the verse:

"But He is with them (with His Knowledge), wherever they may be." [Sūrah Al-Mujadilah 58:7]

Allāh says:

"And He is with you (by His Knowledge) wherever you may be." [Sūrah Al-Hadid 57: 4]

Allāh is specifically with some people through His sustenance, care, giving success. To secure this status, one should particularly commit to the remembrance of Allāh (سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَ). Allāh (سُبْحَانهُ وَتَعَالَى) says:

"I am with my servant when he remembers Me and his lips move with My mention."

When Allāh was with the servant, his life will become happy, and he shall lead a good life.

"Is not Allāh Sufficient for His slave?" [Sūrah Az-Zumar 39:36]

If Allāh is with His servant, no evil will afflict him, and he will be protected, blessed in the worldly life and the Hereafter because Allāh (سُنْبَعَالُهُ وَعَالَى) is with him.

"Truly, Allāh defends those who believe." [Sūrah Al-Hajj 22:38]

These were some reflections on Allāh's verse:

"Verily, in the remembrance of Allāh do the hearts find rest."

We ask Allāh with His beautiful Names and Most High attributes, and we call upon Allāh with every Name of Him with which He has described Himself,

or which He has revealed in His Book, or He has taught to anyone of His creatures, or which He has chosen to keep in the knowledge of the unseen with Him to make our hearts full of the remembrance of Allāh (سُبْحَانُهُوَتَعَالَى) and to set our matters right. O Allāh! Set right our religion by virtue of which my affairs are protected, set right for me my world where my life exists, make good for me my Hereafter which is my resort to which I have to return, and make my life prone to perform all types of good, and make death a comfort for me from every evil. O Allāh! We seek refuge in You from the evil of ourselves and our bad deeds. O Allāh! We seek refuge in You from the evil of the Shaytan and his encouragement to associate others (with You). We beseech You to guide us to the Straight Path and to guide us to every goodness and to make us one of the pious who listens to the Word [good advice] and follows it in the best manner.

Allāh knows best, and may prayers and blessings be upon his servant and Messenger Our Prophet Muḥammad, all his family and his companions.

These are some lines about the benefits of the remembrance of Allāh compiled by Shaykh Abdur Rahman Ibn S' adī (مَعْمُنُهُ), who says:

يُزيلُ الشَّقَا وَالهَمَّ عَنْكَ وَيَطْرُدُ وَإِنْ يَأْتِكَ الْوَسْوَاسُ يَوْمًا يُشَرِّدُ بأَنَّ كَثِيرَ الذِّكْرِ فِي السَّبْقِ مُفْرِدُ عَلَى ذِكْرِهِ وَالشُّكْرِ بِالْحُسْنِ يَعْبُدُ وَقَدْ كَانَ فِي حَمْلِ الشَّـرَائِعِ يَجْهَدُ تُعِينُ عَلَى كُلِّ الْأُمُـورِ وَتُسْعِدُ جِنَّاتِ عَدْنِ وَالمَسَاكِنُ تُمْهَدُ وَمَعْهُ عَلَى كُلِّ الْأُمُ وريُسَدِّدُ وَيَنْقَطِعُ التَّكْلِيفُ حِينَ يُخَـلَّدُوا طَرِيـقُ إِلَى حُبِّ الْإِلَهِ وَمُرْشِـدُ وَعَنْ كُلِّ قَـوْلِ لِلدِّيَانَةِ مُفْسِدُ بِكَثْرَةِ ذِكْرِ اللهِ نِعْمَ المُوَحَّدُ

Remembering Allāh privately and publicly

Removes sadness and distress,

Bestows good matter in this worldly life and the Hereafter.

And will scatter whispering if it comes to you.

And the Prophet told his companions

That remembering a lot make one have gone ahead.

And advised Mu'ādh to seek Allāh's help

To remember, praise and worship well.

And advised someone who sought advice

While he feels acts of worship are too weary

That his tongue should be kept with the remembrance of Allāh.

This helps make matters and make one happy.

And told that remembrance is a fertile land

For Eden paradise and beautiful mansions.

And told that Allāh mentions his servant

And with His slave, everything will be set right.

And told that remembrance will be in paradise,

While there is no acts of worship ordained.

And if there is no benefit in remembrance but

It is a way and a guide to love Allāh.

And forbids doing acts of backbite and gossip

And every saying misuse religion.

We will have a great luck and desire

With remembering Allāh a lot, none has the right to be worshiped but He.

But our ignorance make us remember Allāh very few,

And worship Allāh very few.

These are great lines concerning the benefits of the remembrance of Allāh. All that is mentioned in these lines based on evidence from the Noble Qur' ān and the Sunnah of the Prophet (صَالَتُهُ عَلَيْهُ وَسَالًا).

And Allāh knows best, and May prayers and blessings be upon our Prophet Muḥammad, his family, and his companions.

Questions

<u>Question #1:</u> What are the best books to read concerning remembrance and supplications which are free from weak and fabricated Ḥadīths? And what are the best editions of these books?

Answer: The books which are compiled in this regard are a lot; there are the books of remembrance which are compiled by people of innovation in which remembrance and supplications are created by themselves or based on fabricated Ḥadīths. Muslim should not be occupied with this remembrance, but we should remember Allāh with what is mentioned by the Prophet (مَعَانَتُهُ عَلَيْوَسَلَمُ).

Thus, Muslim should choose the books by the renowned scholars and who care for the Ḥadīth of the Prophet (مَنْ اَللَهُ عَلَيْهُ اللهُ) to benefit from. Fortunately, there are many printed and published books that can be read by the Muslim, such as the book entitled "Al-Wābil As-Sayyib" by Ibn Al-Qayyim (مَعْهُ اللهُ), and the book of Shaykh Al-Islam "Al-Kalim At-Tayyib," and "Tuhfatul Akhyar" by Shaykh Abdul Aziz Ibn Baz.

There are many books based on the authentic Ḥadīth of the Prophet (مَرَالَسُهُ عَلَيْهُ وَسَلَّهُ) the knowledge seeker can benefit from. However, one should keep a distance from the books that are not based on the Sunnah, particularly the ones in which deeds are specified to a certain time [inconsistent with the Sunnah] and remembrances inconsistent with the Noble Qur' ān and the Sunnah of the Prophet (مَرَالَسُهُ عَلَيْهُ وَسَلَّمُ).

Sometimes, laypeople publish papers in which there are particular remembrances and supplications, saying whoever mentioned it would be protected, gain something, and lose something. They invented many benefits without any evidence. So, the Muslim should not pay attention to this or rely upon it.

Question #2: If this supplication for distress is said once, but I still feel distressed, can I repeat it?

It is authentic in the Prophetic Sunnah that this supplication is said in the morning and the evening?

Answer: This supplication is not one of the morning and evening remembrances. If this supplication is said, Allāh will make the sadness, distress, and anxiety go away. So, one should be committed to this supplication. It is important to think about its meaning and to reflect upon its significance so that it

will have a great effect. If one is afflicted with sadness and distress, he should repeat this supplication. This supplication is a resort to Allāh, submission to Him and calling upon Him (سُبْحَانُهُوَعَالَ). So, this supplication should be mentioned again and again if sadness and distress are repeated.

Question #3: Is the Ḥadīth of (nothing averts the Divine Decree but supplication) an authentic Ḥadīth? Can the Divine Decree be averted?

Answer: This Ḥadīth is mentioned by the Prophet (صَالَاتُهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالَمَ

"Nothing averts the Divine Decree but supplication."

Supplication is associated with the Divine Decree. This is the meaning of this Ḥadīth. This means that if one is decreed to get in trouble or so, and he prays for Allāh (شُبْحَانُهُوَعَالَ) to avert this trouble, all this is written in the Preserved Tablet.

"And everything they have done is noted in (their) Records (of deeds). And everything, small and big, is written down (in Al-Lauh Al-Mahfuz already beforehand i.e. before it befalls, or is done by its doer)." [Sūrah Al-Qamar 54:52-53]

Question #4: The Ḥadīth of,

"Whoever says [the following] hundred times in the morning will be guarded against the Shayṭān: 'none has the right to be worshiped but Allāh Alone, no partners with Him, to Him belongs the Bounty, to Him belongs the Praise, He is Able to do all things."

Should it be said hundred times the whole day? Or hundred times in the morning and hundred times in the evening?

Answer: What I remember that this Ḥadīth of,

مَنْ قَالَ لَا إِلَهَ إِلَّا اللَّهُ وَحْدَهُ لَا شَرِيكَ لَهُ لَهُ الْمُلْكُ وَلَهُ الْحُمْدُ وَهُوَ عَلَى كُلِّ شَيْءٍ قَدِيرٌ فِي يَوْمٍ مِائَةَ مَرَّةٍ

"Whoever says none has the right to be worshiped but Allāh Alone, no partners with Him, to Him belongs the Bounty, to Him belongs the Praise, He is Able to do all things hundred times a day."

The other Ḥadīth mentions hundred times in the morning and the evening:

مَنْ قَالَ حِينَ يُصْبِحُ وَحِينَ يُمْسِي سُبْحَانَ اللّهِ وَبِحَمْدِهِ مِائَةَ مَرَّةٍ لَمْ يَأْتِ أَحَدُ يَوْمَ الْقِيَامَةِ بِأَفْضَلَ مِمَّا جَاءَ بِهِ إِلَّا أَحَدُ قَالَ مِثْلَ مَا قَالَ أَوْ زَادَ عَلَيْهِ

"He who recites in the morning and the evening the statement: "Glory be to Allāh" one hundred times, will not be surpassed on the Day of Resurrection by anyone with better deeds than one who utters the same words or utters more of these words."

This Ḥadīth is authentic, and this supplication should be said in the morning and the evening.

Question #5: One asks about a book entitled "Fiqh of Al-Adkār and supplications;" is the compiler of this book published the other part of it?

<u>Answer:</u> What I know is that the second part is about to be printed in shaa Allāh. May Allāh make it easy to be printed and benefited from.

Question #6: What is the meaning of remembrance of Allāh inside one's heart?

Answer: Ibn Al-Qayyim said in his book entitled "Al-Wābil As-Sayyib" that remembrance of Allāh is divided into two types: remembrance of Allāh by the heart and by the tongue. Remembrance of Allāh (سُنَحَانُوْرَتَعَالَ) by the heart means glorifying and loving Allāh, remembering His Grandeur and His Names and Attributes. Remembrance of Allāh by tongue indicates glorifying (saying Subhānallāh), praising (saying Al-Hamdulillah), Tahlil (saying La ilaha illa Allāh), Takbir (saying Allahu Akbar) and recitation of the Qur'ān; all this is a remembrance of Allāh.

Remembrance of Allāh may be of the heart and tongue, and the best is to remember Allāh by both, tongue and heart.

Allāh Knows best, and prayers and blessings be upon our Prophet Muḥammad, his family, and his companions.
