## Correct method of exhorting dying person to say Shahahdah

## بسم الله الرحمن الرحيم

In the name of Allaah, the Most Merciful, the Bestower of Mercy

The Imaam said, "[What is meant by] exhorting a dying person to say Laa ilaaha illaallaah at the time of death [i.e., the talqeen] is not that the Shahahdah be mentioned in his presence and that he [just] be made to hear it—rather it is that he be directed to say it—in opposition to what some people think, and the proof is the hadeeth of Anas, (رضي الله عليه وسَلَّم)<sup>1</sup>, 'That Allaah's Messenger (وصَلَّى الله عَلَيْهِ وَسَلَّم)<sup>2</sup> visited a man from the Ansaar, and said, 'O maternal uncle! Say, 'Laa ilaaha illaallaah!' So he said, '[Am I] a maternal or paternal uncle?' So he said, 'A maternal one.' He said, 'Is it better for me to say, 'Laa ilaaha illaallaah?" So the Prophet (صَلَّى اللهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَلَّم) said, 'Yes.'"
