
Sending prayers upon the Prophet, (صلى الله عليه وسلم)

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بِسْمِ اللَّهِ الرَّحْمَنِ الرَّحِيمِ

Ammaar bin Yaasir (rad iyallaahu `anhu)¹ said, “Allaah’s Messenger (صلى الله عليه وسلم)² said:

‘Indeed Allaah has assigned an angel to my grave, He has given him the names of [all] creation. So no-one sends prayers upon me until the Day of Judgment except that he informs me of that person’s name and his father’s name, [saying]: ‘This is so and so the son of so and so, he has sent prayers upon you.’”³

Note: Sending prayers on the Prophet (صلى الله عليه وسلم) is when a person says **sallallaahu ‘alayhi wa sallam** (May the peace and blessings of Allaah be upon him) after mentioning the Prophet (صلى الله عليه وسلم).
