

## When struck by a calamity

Allaah's Messenger - (صلى الله عليه وسلم) $^1$ - opened a door between himself and the people, or he raised a curtain , and found that the people were praying behind Aboo Bakr (رضي الله عنه) $^2$ , so he praised Allaah for the fine state of theirs which he saw, and had hope that Allaah would leave them upon good after him just as he saw , and he said :

<<O people! whoever from the people -or: the Believers- is struck with a calamity , then let him take consolation for his calamity in losing anyone besides me by [remembering] his calamity in losing me -, for no one from my Ummah will ever be struck by a calamity after me which is severer upon him than the calamity of losing me.>>³
