Returning to disobedience after Hajj

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بسم الله الرحمن الرحيم

In the name of Allaah, the Most Merciful, the Bestower of Mercy

Shaykh al-Uthaymeen (رَحِمَهُ اللهُ):

Returning to disobedience after the performance of the obligatory Hajj is a great loss; for the Prophet (مَعَلَى اللهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَلَّمَ) said:

"He who performs Hajj and does not behave obscenely nor does he behave evilly, then he will return (i.e., from his sins) just as the day his mother gave birth to him."

And he (صَلَّى اللهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَلَّمَ) said:

So if the person completes it then from that which would be unfortunate is if the scroll is rolled up upon him committing evil deeds after the Hajj. Similar to this is the season of fasting in Ramadhaan. If the person returns to disobedience (after Ramadhaan) then he has suffered a tremendous loss. It is upon him to return to Allaah all over again; seek forgiveness and repent. The one who repents from a sin is like one who hasn't done the sin, or even better than that. Perhaps a person, after his sin-if he repents to Allaah and seeks forgiveness—will be in a better state than he was before that. Have you not seen Aadam, of allaah, (عزوجل), said about him:

[Thus did Aadam disobey his Lord, so he went astray; then his Lord chose him, and accepted his repentance, and gave him guidance.]⁷
