Shaykh Mashoor Hasan said, "Our Shaykh, (رَحِبَهُ اللهُ), charged me with reviewing some of the volumes of *As-Silsilah ad-Da'eefah* before it was printed ... he gave me the fifth volume of *Ad-Da'eefah*. So I took the volume from him [which was written] in his own handwriting before it was printed.

When I took it out of the bag [it was in] and saw it I started to cry.

The Shaykh (رَحِمَهُ اللهُ) asked me, "What is wrong with you?"

So I didn't say anything, and the Shaykh (رَحِمَهُ اللهُ) saw the tears in my eyes.

The Shaykh (رَحِفَهُ الله), had written the fifth volume of *Ad-Da'eefah* on gift paper, and on the paper bags used for sugar and rice, the red [paper] bags which the people would weigh sugar and rice in.

So the Shaykh (رَحِمَهُ الله), said to me, "I used to have thread which I would place in ink. Then I would place this thread on the paper and so the paper would become lined." And he (رَحِمَهُ الله) said, "I didn't have any money to buy paper with.""
